Doosan Forklift Parts - Doosan Infracore Company Ltd. is an international and intercontinental company that consists of Defense Industry Products, Industrial Vehicles, Diesel Engines, Automation Systems, Machine Tools and Construction Equipment.

Their United States affiliate, Doosan Infracore America Corporation, stationed in Suwanee, Georgia houses a 170,000 square foot manufacturing facility, home to a Compact Equipment and Construction division. Cleveland, Ohio houses the Lift Truck division, and West Caldwell, New Jersey has a Machine Tool department. The U.S. headquarters in Georgia facilitates a first rate parts operation capable of supplying an excess of 25,000 line items to support Lift Truck, Compact Equipment, Machine Tool and Construction client desires.

With a system consisting of over 90 independent dealers, the lift truck group supplies quality materials handling equipment to the broad North American market. Doosan Infracore America Forklift dealers successfully operate in over 220 service and product sales places throughout Canada and the U.S. The forklift product line remarkably features 63 distinctive models consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion lift trucks. Capacities of these various truck designs vary from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All trucks are manufactured in an ISO 9001 qualified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest expanding forklift company in the North American marketplace, thanks to their stability in retaining a high degree of customer service excellence and optimum product performance to all Doosan Infracore Forklift users. The U.S. forklift division stationed in Cleveland has a professional team experienced in Sales, Purchasing, Marketing, Logistical and Technical Support.

Korea's initial home-based forklift marketplace was an open-import enterprise. In the 1960's, Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. began to import assembled forklifts as part of a nationwide equipment expansion project. Initial product sales of this manufacturing equipment focused on large business communities, the armed forces and on state-run firms. This ultimately led to a unification with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division commenced business operations throughout Korea to overhaul and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a lift truck production plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical education became the new focus for enhancing quality and product development.

Domestic forklift business for Daewoo started in 1967 and grew to an amazing 90% market share in Korea. By the 1980's, Daewoo's progressive technological advancements combined with sales success placed them in a position of substantial growth of their forklift business.

In 1981, Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the United States, proposed a cooperative enterprise project to respond to competitive pressures in the US materials handling industry. This venture greatly expanded Daewoo's forklift sales. Construction was finished in 1984 to facilitate a contemporary plant which helped establish the company for the fabrication of high added-value goods suitable for export. In 1993, the company had a global sales network and started exporting models they had established through in-house expertise, as an sovereign brand. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing expansion opportunities into overseas markets.
